

{ CCSAP History

The College Coalition for Substance Abuse Prevention, formerly known as the Washington State Substance Abuse College Task Force (WSSACTF), was established in 1985.

Currently, CCSAP is funded by DASA, which covers travel expenses, training and other administrative assistance. CCSAP also receives support from the BACCHUS and GAMMA Peer Education Network and The Network of Colleges and Universities Committed to the Elimination of Drug and Alcohol Abuse (The Network).

In February 2001 CCSAP developed a Steering Committee, which provides direction to the Coalition regarding implementation of a Statewide Initiative on alcohol abuse prevention.

Today, CCSAP provides a variety of services and education to 2 year community & technical colleges as well as 4 year colleges and universities.

{ Harm Reduction

Our approach:

- The primary goal of Harm Reduction (HR) is to provide education & services designed to reduce risks associated with substance use.
- HR is focused on helping students to make safe choices & to minimize unwanted consequences of substance use (hangover, blackout, detox, academic difficulties, regrets, etc).
- Abstinence from substance use is encouraged as a choice, especially if students are under 21.
- HR is based on acceptance, both of those who choose not to drink and those who do drink.

Thirty-seven separate schools are represented on the coalition!

Of these, 20 are two-year community colleges or technical colleges and 17 are four-year colleges & universities.

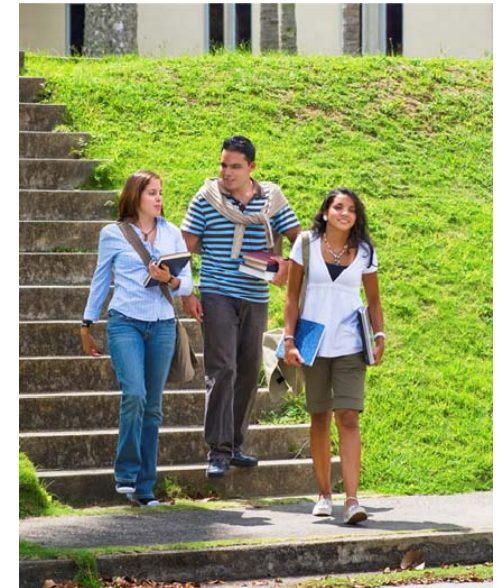
